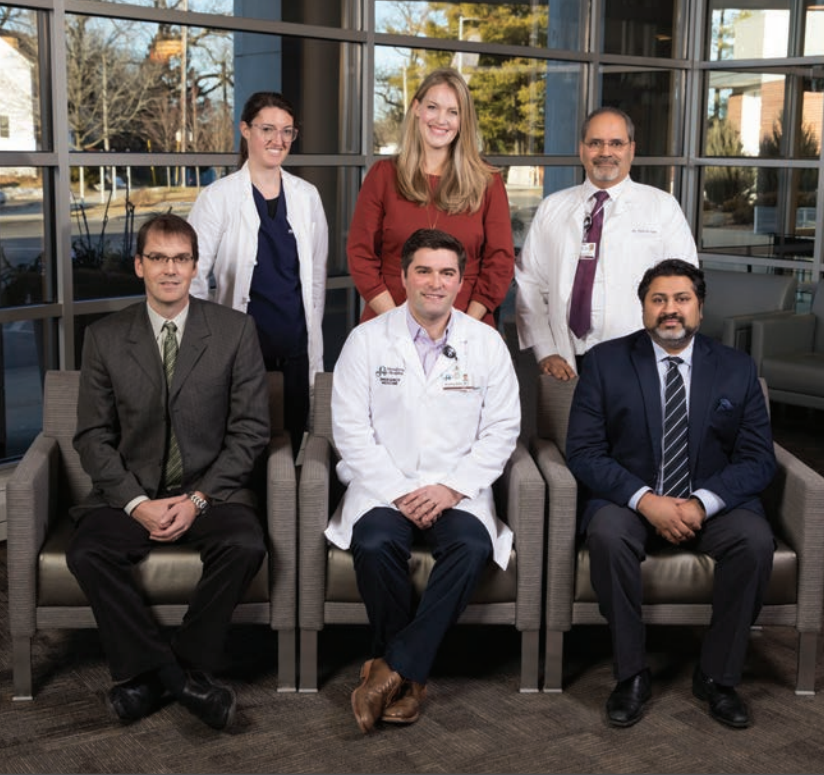

Safely Meeting YOUR Health Needs Locally

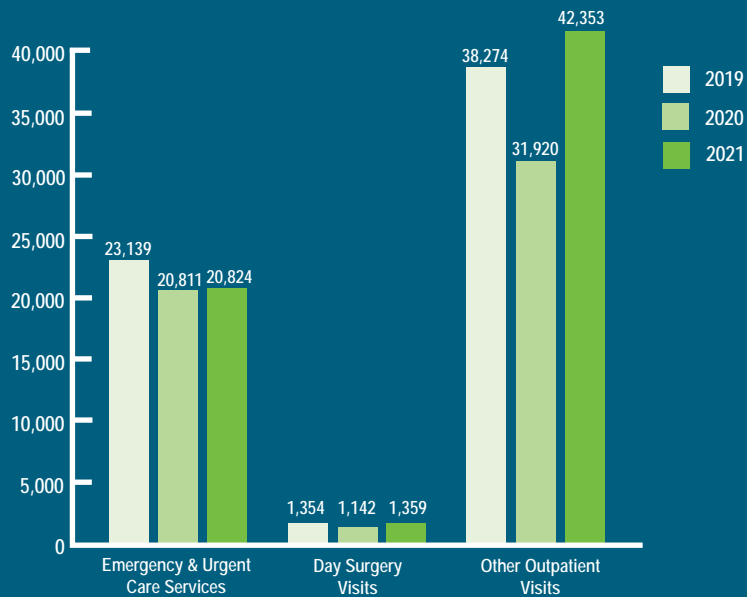

Dr. Eugene Kaji, Cardiologist, provides services at Stoughton Health's newly opened Cardiology Clinic located at Stoughton Hospital.

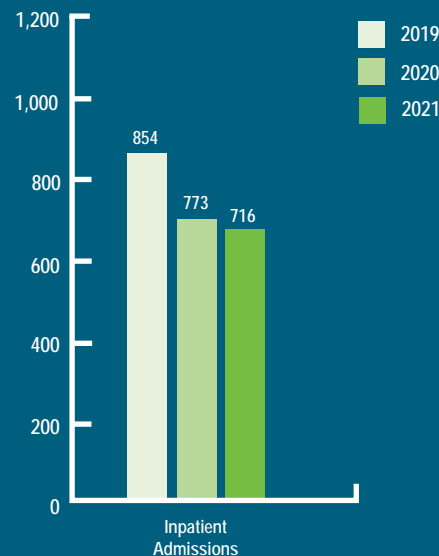
OUTPATIENT VISITS

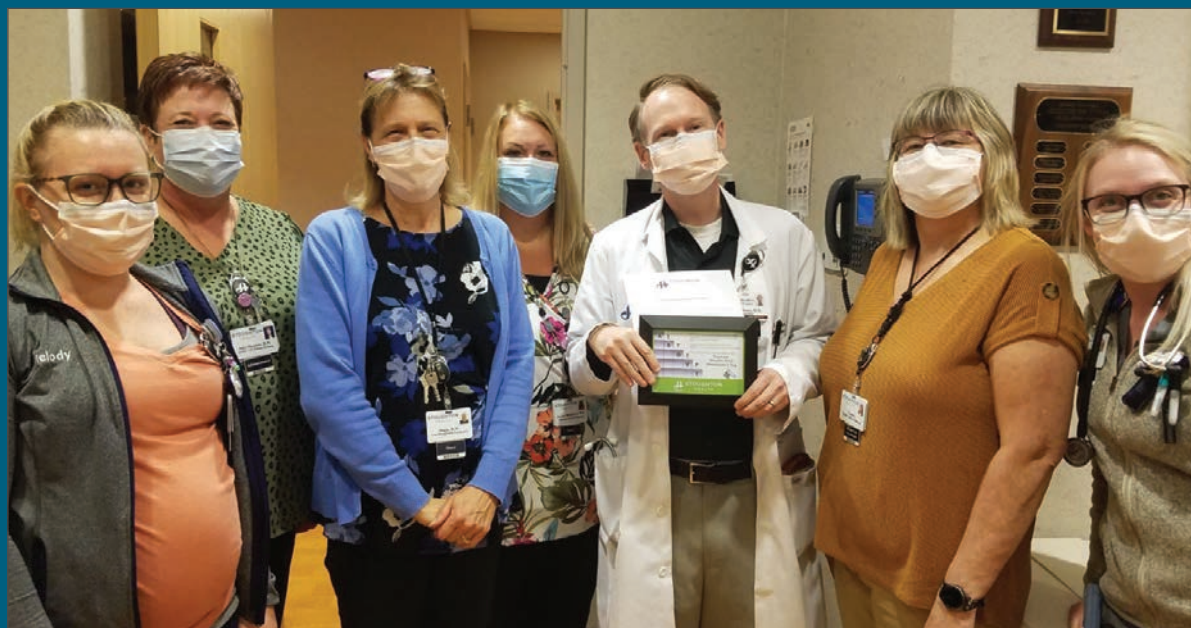

Giving Back to Our Community

Even with the COVID-19 pandemic, Stoughton Health worked hard to be a good partner and collaborate with local clinics, civic organizations, chambers, neighboring hospitals, schools, businesses, wellness coalitions, other non-profits and more.

Stoughton Health safely hosted six blood drives which collected 211 units. We offered multiple educational classes such as Yoga, Mindfulness, Forgiveness, Advance Care Planning and more to provide relief for increased mental health issues. We held nutrition and physical activity classes to improve chronic conditions such as heart disease and diabetes. To improve safety, we offered Safe Sitter, Safe at Home, Compression Only CPR, Balance Classes and more.

We continue to participate with and sponsor local events such as the Syttende Mai Parade, Toys for Tots, Coffee Break Festival, local Chambers, and support health initiatives through contributions made to American Cancer Society, American Heart Association, Alzheimer's Association and National Alliance for Mental Illness.

In addition, through collaboration with the Stoughton Wellness Coalition, over 3100 pounds of medication and sharps were collected and properly disposed of during the October 2020 and April 2021 Medication and Sharp Collections.
