This Week in Engagement

Every week the Administrative Council (AC) will give you a look into what they are working on to make Stoughton Health a great place to work and receive care.

This week we're hearing from Michelle Abey, Vice President of Finance.

What have you been working on?

SHOC, SHOC & more SHOC with all the team who are working so hard to make this space a reality! As we draw closer to the opening there have been all kinds of details to work out including signage, coat hooks, printers that don't fit exactly where they were planned for, etc. etc.

Wayfinding has been a constant topic in this project. Patients will enter at the lower level/Outpatient Center entrance and be registered there. Two kiosks have been installed which will be used by Cardiac Rehab & Rehab (PT, OT, ST) patients to check-in for appointments following their first one. Specialty clinic patients will not be able to use the kiosks at this time. Specialty Clinic patients will receive a lettered, colored card signifying which specialty clinic hallway they should go to see their provider. Patients will take their card to the first floor where they will turn left off the elevators and find the hallway with the letter on their card (A, B, C or D) and take a seat in the chairs. Staff will see the patient has arrived and go to get them from the waiting area. The doors to the hallways are badge access only so patients will not be able to get to the exam room without a staff person.

Why is this important to staff?

The SHOC opening is a significant change for the teams moving to this new space. With change, comes anxiety and fear of the unknown for many. We are often creatures of habit and routine so for many of our colleagues, all of their workday habits are changing. Think about that – where they park, where they place their coat/purse/bag, then new keyboards, computers, mice to use, new hallways to navigate, supplies in different spots – all of it is NEW! Which is exciting but also unnerving at the same time. Our leadership motto developed by our workflow and project lead, Liz Touchett, is “Let's settle & see” so that's what we are going to do. I tell you this because we may start doing things one way but change to another if we find that there is a better way to improve the patient experience or be more efficient for our team. Change is a constant in healthcare but even more so with the opening of a new building!
